### TREASURER'S REPORT

Our offering for the last 3 months amounted to :

May : £2152.45

June: £1940.65

July: £1852.70

As the end of our financial year is coming up I am doing a review of our finances. Financially we are doing well which is enabling us to keep our building well maintained, although there is still work to be done.

Our expenses this year so far are £34,688 which is nearly £3,000 per month. Our income totals £33,575 so far. We have the month of August to add on and hopefully we will receive our Gift Aid Rebate which will take our Income above our Expenses.

I will soon be ordering the offertory envelopes for next year. If anyone, who doesn't already do so, would like to give their offering by Standing Order I can give you details. If you are a tax payer you can Gift Aid you donation if you use envelopes or standing order.

I offer very grateful thanks to people who have reviewed their giving. This can mean your giving being increased, reduced or staying the same. We can also give our time, not necessarily money, to aid the work of the church, showing God's love to Warminster town

He remained a committed member of our church although unable to attend after moving to Westbury, supported us in his prayers, as well as financially, and when I last visited was remembering the names of all his old friends here. It was an honour to know him.
